Regina, SK - FROST Regina presented by Co-op wrapped up its final day on Sunday, February 2, 2025. This marked the fourth year for the festival which, over the course of four winter days saw over 29,400 visitors at all three hubs throughout Regina.

Frost @ Downtown featuring Frost @ REAL events, Frost @ Wascana and Frost @ Warehouse transformed the city into a winter wonderland full of outdoor and indoor activities. For the first time this event also featured **The Grind**, a premier street-style snowboarding series in collaboration with Canada Snowboard. Despite the cold temperatures the public came to experience and enjoy FROST Regina.

Due to these weather challenges the Frost @ Downtown hub had to close on the final day of FROST Regina. However, the action continued at Frost @ Wascana and Frost @Warehouse! Wascana Centre continued to offer dog sled rides and family programming throughout the day, while Regina's Warehouse District also provided programming options for those who wanted to experience the event indoors, through their Frost Circuit, and programming at businesses throughout the district.

Following are statistics from the event:

- 43 Volunteers helped with the event over three days
- Served over 7,470 cups of hot chocolate across all hubs
- **16 Snowboarders** competed in the Grind, with 30 locals participating in the Local Rail Jam event
- Served over 1,600 treats at the Sugar Shack Downtown
- **56 loads of snow** were brought into Victoria Park from YQR Airport to set up the event site
- **6 Shipping Containers and 2,700 square feet of scaffolding** were used to create the Grind Ramp in Victoria Park
- 1,927 Frost Pins were traded across the hubs
- Two dogsled teams made over 600 laps around the track at Wascana Centre
- Over 650 Pancakes were served at the Pancake Lunch Downtown
- Over 500 Passports were handed out throughout the Frost Circuit in the Warehouse District
- Nearly 900 Riders used the SGI Shuttle to explore the Frost Circuit
- **Over 400 participants visited Apex Adventure** Plex in Regina's Warehouse District in the span of 2 hours
- More than 50 players enjoyed free pool at The Break Pool Hall.
- **30 Snowboards were painted** live at the downtown hub across 3 days.
